

**Appendix 25****Discussion Questions for Study Groups****Executive Summary**

This appendix supplies the structured discussion apparatus that makes the corpus tractable through collective engagement — the analytical instruments it develops become far easier to grasp in conversation than in solitary reading.

Its questions are designed as prompts rather than examination items: each is open-ended, admits of several well-grounded responses, and is meant to sustain an exchange of perspectives rather than elicit a single correct answer.

What's inside

- Roughly one hundred thirty-six discussion questions.
- Seven sub-sections: six that track the six sections of the meta-analysis, plus a cross-cutting set.
- Every question tagged for audience (academic seminar, policy reading group, community discussion) and difficulty (foundational, intermediate, advanced).
- Follow-up prompts a facilitator can use to extend or redirect a discussion.

How to use it

The appendix works both as a complete session-design resource — the facilitator selects questions across sub-sections to compose a session — and as a single-session focus resource, working through one section's questions in sequence. It keeps the corpus's even-handed posture: it does not presume or require any particular normative starting point, and several questions are framed to surface competing positions rather than suppress them.
